## NASA Honors Taber<sup>®</sup> Industries with Excellence Award

On Wednesday May 26, 2004 NASA honored Taber Industries with the "EVA Office Recognition of Excellence" Award. Taber was recognized for excellent technical performance and continued diligence in the design, development, and successful delivery of the Secondary Oxygen Pressure Transducer assemblies for integration into the Primary Life Support System. The award includes a patch, representing the EVA Team that was flown aboard the Shuttle Orbiter Atlantis, during STS-110, April 8-19, 2002.



Since 1955, Taber Industries has been manufacturing pressure transducers. With a focus on critical pressure measurement applications, Taber was involved with the initial Apollo spacecraft launch in 1965. Since then, the company has been involved with numerous life support and flight hardware in space, aviation and military vehicle applications.
